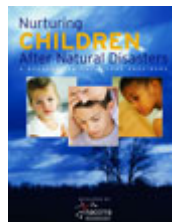

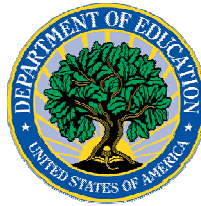

### Race to the Top – Early Learning Challenge

The U.S. Departments of Education and Health and Human Services released the final application for the Race to the Top-Early Learning Challenge funds which provide \$500 million to states through competitive grants.

The purpose of these grants is to improve the quality of early learning and development and close the achievement gap for children with high needs. This is an enormous opportunity to build a more unified approach to supporting children from birth through age 5.
